

MAAP Presents at IAMUS

Last October 26-29, 2016, MAAP sent two midshipmen to participate in the International Association Maritime Universities Students (IAMUS) held at Vietnam Maritime University, Hai Phong, Vietnam.

The IAMUS workshop is a part of the IAMU Annual General Assembly (AGA) 2016 intended for students from IAMU member institutions to present their respective project work. It is an opportunity for students to participate in maritime education and training related activities, meet and exchange ideas with students from other institutions, interact with different industry members and experience other cultures.



The two MAAP midshipmen, Midn. 2cl Andre' Chad Acosta and Midn. 3cl Junel Kristian Semana, submitted their abstracts among 55 others. 25 abstracts were accepted by the Paper Committee for presentation in the said event, which included the aforementioned midshipmen's works.

Midn. 2cl Acosta and Midn. 3cl Semana, being the youngest presenters, were commended for their excellent presentations. Semana presented his paper with the title "Status, Problems and Prospects of the Integrated Simulator Training Program of the Maritime Academy of Asia and the Pacific." On the other hand, Midn. 2cl Acosta garnered recognition as one of the top three presentations with his research title, "Relevance, Effectiveness and Further Improvements of the Integrated Simulator Training Program Offered at the Maritime Academy of Asia and the Pacific."

The top three presenters including Midn. 2cl Acosta; Aleksandra Goralczyk and Marta Wojtczyk (Poland); and Marc Weise (Germany), were awarded with certificates of outstanding presentation. Consequently, the top three presentations were once again showcased in the closing ceremony with the IAMU delegates. On the other hand, certificates of honorable mention were given to the next two best presenters namely Moeko Sakai (Japan) and Prezemislaw Dudzik and Natalia Jarozk (Poland).
